

Great Massingham Church of England Primary School results 2017

We are proud of the results achieved this year. The published data shows that we are performing at least in line* or better than National expectations in KS1 reading and maths and in KS2 in all areas. We are particularly proud of the high percentage of pupils working beyond national expectation at KS2.

*It should be noted that small cohorts mean that just above or just below National figures indicate that the school is generally in line with national. In some cohorts one child could equate to as much as 20% or 25%.

All data in bold underlined show where we have exceeded National attainment.

Figures in green indicate the percentage of pupils working at 'Greater Depth' or above age related expectation.

At KS1 results are based on teacher assessments. National Curriculum test papers are used as an indicator of pupil attainment to support Teacher assessment.

KS1 Pupils achieved well above national attainment in Reading and are working in line with National attainment (based on cohort size) for Writing and Maths. The percentage of pupils working above national expectation is well above National figures for Reading and Writing and is in line with national for above expected in Maths.

*KS2 results are based on the test papers from May 2017.
